

Message from the Headteacher

I suspect every Headteacher in the country will look back on this term and describe it as eventful and challenging. We began the term in lockdown delivering a mixture of online learning for most and face to face learning in school for others. We then had the task of ensuring every boy was tested in school three times before we were able to settle back into some sense of normality.

Yet again I want to thank all parents for your co-operation and patience when returning the boys to school to have their first lateral flow test. The process on the first few days went very smoothly and I was delighted we had the whole school back and in normal lessons by lunchtime on the second day. I was also pleased that we were able to ensure every boy received three lateral flow tests by the start of the second week with minimal disruption to their learning. This was made possible due to the huge effort of staff going above and beyond what was expected of them. The site team built the testing centre virtually overnight and were then able to dismantle it and build new testing booths in the boarding houses immediately afterwards. Many staff, led by Mrs Wilkinson, gave up hours of their own time to help administer the tests and complete all the necessary paperwork. The process of continuing to test the boarders and ensure that all out-boarders have enough home test kits has also meant additional pressure has been placed on staff on top of their normal day job. So, I want to thank all the staff who made this happen as once again I am reminded of how lucky I am to lead such a fantastic group of people.

Boys settled back into Brymore life very quickly and we have continued to offer as many of the after-school activities as we can. Chads has been well attended and we were able to hold the house rugby during games lessons. It is our intention to hold some sort of sports day this year, although we do not know whether we can invite parents at this stage. The key summer sports of cricket and athletics will take place however, we are again unsure whether we will be able to compete against other schools. It is also our intention to have a Year 11 Leavers Service and if we are unable to invite parents, then we will certainly ensure it is live-streamed so that parents are able to feel part of the service.

The key message this year remains the same. We will try and give the boys as many opportunities as we can whilst continuing to ensure they remain safe. Whilst it is pleasing to report that we have not had a case of Covid-19 in school, we of course will not relax any of the measures that we have in place until we feel it is safe to do so.

I hope you all have a relaxing Easter break and that you enjoy your time together as a family.

Horticulture

It's been a very busy time for us so we welcomed boys back with open arms to help in the gardens.

So much has been achieved including seed sowing, pricking out the seedlings and then potting on larger plants. Splitting and repotting perennials, watering and weeding.

We have also planted up the first of the raised beds outside Reid and Kemp House, planted a woodland themed garden outside the potting shed and started to replant the perennial border on the south side of the walled garden.

Rogue raspberry canes have been removed from amongst the soft fruit bushes. The canes have been cut back, replanted and tied in place. The soft fruit bushes have been pruned and given a dressing of farmyard manure. Fruits from last summer were frozen, made into jams and chutneys but we still have some available to purchase.

The early potatoes have been planted, as have the onions.

The rhubarb is growing well and the boys are getting their plots prepared and some have already sown various crops.

Garden duties are always a busy time and the new Year 10 HoDs have begun to learn how to manage students. Year 8 students need to remember to come appropriately dressed and ready to get on with tasks set but have been doing a good job every week.

The site is looking resplendent with all the spring flowers and the hanging baskets, planted up last autumn outside of the hall, are now coming into their own.

We are, as ever, grateful for all the hard work of the team and also many thanks to Mrs Kingston for managing a stall outside her house, selling plants to the public.

We are also glad when parents remember to ask us about plants when they are refurbishing their gardens. When you are allowed you will see all the hard work of Mrs Stanley and Mrs Osborne, who have revamped the sales area and we hope it will make it easier to access the plants and to be able to see what there is on sale. Should anyone wish anything specific or have any requests then please do contact the school and we will see what we can do.

In the meantime we wish you all happy gardening and thank those who support the weekly sale cart on the basketball court.




Year 11 Leavers Hoodies

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Farm

Our first year of lambing in the new shed kicked off with a good start on 26th February with a healthy triplet.

Since then we have had an exceptional lambing season with our lambing percentage currently sitting at exactly 200%, with two ewes left to lamb. The boys have enjoyed the lambs and the weekend boarders have been involved in helping too - even enjoying their takeaway on the farm.

Due to us having mainly Dairy Shorthorn cattle who were producing very little milk because of the 18 month gap, we took the decision to dry all 16 of them off now ready for block calving to begin in September.

We have had two more litters of Gloucester Old Spot piglets born on the farm so watch this space for pork being available in the coming summer months, ready for barbequing.

Thank you to everyone who completed our farm survey about a milk vending machine. We are progressing well with the venture of being able to sell our milk from the farm and will keep you all updated but we may well be looking for help with our label designs too! (Miss Parker)

House Reading Competition

World Book Day 2021

World Book Day this year was a very different event to the one we usually celebrate at Brymore: no hilarious costumes, no competitions and no sponsored read. However, we couldn't let it pass unnoticed and therefore the English team set the students in Key Stage 3 a challenge: to read as many words as they could over a two-week period. The top 50 boys across the three year groups would be rewarded for their efforts and commitment to reading and had the chance to earn a new 'Reading Royalty' badge. The now coveted pewter pig badge, representative of Old Major from 'Animal Farm' taught in Year 9, was awarded to a mix of students across all ability ranges. Our top performing reader in year 9 managed almost 600,000 words in two weeks. Next year, students will be set the same challenge and they will have the opportunity to earn Benjamin, the pewter donkey badge.

Digital Library

Our new digital library 'myON' is proving popular with our Key Stage 3 students. All students in Years 7, 8 and 9 have access at <u>https://www.myon.co.uk</u> They can log on using the same details they use for their Accelerated Reader account. Students can search for books in their Z.P.D, receive personalised recommendations and be taken straight to an Accelerated Reader quiz on completion of a book. All books have the option of being accompanied by an audio narration.

Student progress

As we are two thirds of the way through the academic year, we expect our students to be well on their way to achieving their personalised reading target set at the beginning of the year. If every student is on track, they should be in the region of 66%. The bronze, silver, gold and platinum reading badges will be awarded in the summer as usual as well as the house reading cup.
