They boys are always appreciative of the food and it is always a great atmosphere when the boys from all year groups get together in the common room and eat together.

Several of the boys in School House are also keen rugby players and one of our significant events this term was the rugby finals at North Petherton, where Year 9, 10 and 11 teams played and fought hard against their opposing teams from other schools. All teams

We often say that it is important to balance studies with other things, so we also encourage regular breaks, to get involved in physical activities and of course, there is aways a cuppa and a snack on hand to keep up their energy!

It is also this time of year that we begin the process of establishing who may want to apply to become Head Boy or to occupy a position of leadership within the school. At the time of writing, current Year 10's are beginning this process and will be applying and completing both the forms and doing relevant interviews over the coming weeks.
